

## Institutional Scholarship Awards Terms & Conditions:

Keiser University has the option to rescind merit scholarships in the event housing or residency status changes after awarding.

The recipient qualifies to receive a scholarship for each of the four academic years\* of continuous undergraduate\*\* study at the Flagship Campus if all the following conditions are satisfied:

- Recipients must be full-time at the University (Or the amount will be pro-rated) and complete at least 12 credit hours each semester. (6 Credits) for Graduate Students. The award could be adjusted should a student fall below full-time status.
- Students may not use merit scholarships for courses, internships, or practicums that are non-credit-bearing.
- Merit Scholarships cannot result in an over-award or refund and are not to exceed institutional charges. Institutional charges include tuition, fees, books, and room & board.
- If the recipient is unable to maintain the following yearly grade point averages the merit scholarship could be adjusted or withdrawn.

Earned Credit Hours	Yearly GPA Requirement
1-29	2.0
30-59	2.5
60+	2.75

### Earned Credit Hours

\*Transfer Students (Greater than 60 Credit Hours) must maintain a yearly grade point average (not a cumulative average) of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, with continuous enrollment, and will receive awards up to six full semesters

\*Graduate Students must maintain a yearly grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, with continuous enrollment, and will receive awards up to the duration of the degree program

Should the recipient be placed on administrative probation, or be found guilty of an Honor Code violation, the scholarship could be withdrawn, at the discretion of the university, and charges to the student shall be adjusted according to the University's refund policy.

An adjustment to the amount of the scholarship could be made according to the University's refund policy should the recipient withdraw from school during the academic year.
